Donation Drive - Preparation for our Twilight Market - IDEAS LIST

We need your help to make this a fantastic fundraising event for our school. We are seeking donations for various stalls that we will be having at the event. We have decided to do this in 2 week sessions for different types of donations.

For every donation, students will receive a raffle ticket, which will be placed in a draw to win *'unlimited rides access'* for the whole evening in the form of a special wristband. The more donations then the more raffle tickets given and the more chances to win the free wristband. There will be 7 wristbands to be won – one for each grade (K, Yr 1, Yr 2, Yr 3, Yr 4, Yr 5, Yr 6). Raffle tickets will also be given for the Tombola donations and Hamper donations too.

Students are to give their donations to their class teacher. A washing basket will be placed in each classroom and cleared daily. The class teacher will mark off students' names as they donate items. Each donation will be marked separately. Items may also be handed in to the school office and staff will record donations to ensure children get a raffle ticket for each item donated for the wristband draw. The wristband draw will take place on *Thursday 6th December* before our Twilight Market Day. If a wristband has already been pre-purchased through Flexi-Schools (more details will be available soon for these) then the money will be refunded to the family.

(bottles/ jars/ containers of food or drink items eg. tomato sauce, soft drink, cordial, jams, chutneys, olives, pasta sauces, marinade sauces, dressings, wine/alcohol*, etc). **Please note that any donated alcohol items can't be brought to school by children and we ask that parents deliver these to the office themselves.*

Weeks 7 & 8 (Monday 26th November – Wednesday 5th December 2018) – Items for hampers (Christmas Food Hampers, Family Fun Hampers, Pamper Pack Hampers – items like non-perishable foods – canned ham, plum puddings, pretzels, fruit cake, chips, tins of biscuits, Christmas bon bons, novelty items, family games, cards, toys, colouring in books, packs of pencils/crayons, DVDs, books, bathroom supplies – creams, shampoos, bath bombs, soaps, towels, etc)

Aim and Role of the School Council:

The aim of the School Council is to foster closer links between Winston Heights Public School and its community, enabling formal school community participation in the planning and governance of the school.

The role of the School Council is to provide a consultative decision-making process for the Principal and the school Executive, relating to policies and goals for the school, according to the needs of the students and the local community. The School Council is made up of parents & carers (four representatives), school staff (Principal and two teaching staff) and a community member. The School Council plays an important role in making sure that the whole community is involved in important decisions made by the school.

Consultative decision-making means that groups in a school community have the opportunity to receive information, engage in discussion, put forward ideas, and have their views considered in making a final decision. This does not mean that a majority vote of any or all identified groups in the school community is required. The Principal, after consideration of the views of the school community, will make decisions that best meet the needs of students attending the school.

Meetings:

The School Council meets twice a term in the third and seventh week of term on a Wednesday evening.
