#### **Tell Them From Me Survey**

During this term students, staff and community members will have the opportunity to complete a Tell Them From Me survey. This survey is set by the Department and occurs every year. All responses are anonymous. We appreciate the feed-back you provide to ensure our school continues to improve in educational delivery for our students. The survey for students will be conducted for Years 4-6 only and will be held at school. Parents may wish to withdraw their child from participating in the survey. This will be outlined in more detailed information sent home about the survey shortly.

#### NCCD Survey 2019

Each year our school completes a survey for National Consistent Collection of Data. Our Learning and Support teachers go through all the specialised and differentiated learning programs that our students have undertaken at school in the last 12 months and record it through the Department of Education's secure collection site. This data is updated annually. Children who are also on health care plans and Individual Learning Plans also have their data recorded.

#### **Public Speaking**

Our class competitions have commenced for all students in Years K-6 with the prepared speeches. By the end of Week 4 all classes will have selected 2 representatives to go onto the Stage Finals to be held in the school hall during Monday of Week 5. Kindergarten will hold their final on Wednesday.

#### **Rotary Club Writing Competition**

A huge congratulations to Lorenzo, Reva and Will from Year 6 who were our school finalists in the Rotary Club Writing Competition this year. They attended a presentation evening on Monday and were fantastic ambassadors for Winston Heights. ## **Chaplain Chat**

#### Grief and Loss in Children

Sadly we all struggle with the loss of loved ones from time to time and our children are not immune from such sad events. Maybe a grandparent, an aunt or uncle, even a sibling or a parent may pass away or leave that child's life. We as the remaining adults in their lives don't always know how to support them.

These days, the impact of grief on children is acknowledged by society, and many resources are available to help them cope with these inevitable changes. As chaplain, I can help you and them to navigate these changes. Please speak to me or to your child's teacher if this is the kind of support your child could benefit from.

Next week, Play School is presenting an episode specifically about grief and loss called Beginnings and Endings. Its screening on Monday 19<sup>th</sup> August, at 9am but you can see an advanced screen on this link. <u>http://www.abc.net.au/abcforkids/articles/playschoolbeginningsandendings.htm</u>

The Beginnings and Endings episode has been made in consultation with the National Centre for Childhood Grief, who worked with the Play School team throughout the development of the show. The Centre recognised that there is currently very little available to help children experiencing grief and that introducing the subject in a gentle, safe environment, as this episode is doing, is a great way to help children start to understand life and death.

#### Aim and Role of the School Council:

The aim of the School Council is to foster closer links between Winston Heights Public School and its community, enabling formal school community participation in the planning and governance of the school.

The role of the School Council is to provide a consultative decision-making process for the Principal and the School Executive, relating to policies and goals for the school, according to the needs of the students and the local community. The School Council is made up of parents & carers (four representatives), school staff (Principal and two teaching staff) and a community member. The School Council plays an important role in making sure that the whole community is involved in important decisions made by the school.

Consultative decision-making means that groups in a school community have the opportunity to receive information, engage in discussion, put forward ideas, and have their views considered in making a final decision. This does not mean that a majority vote of any or all identified groups in the school community is required. The Principal, after consideration of the views of the school community, will make decisions that best meet the needs of students attending the school.

#### **Meetings:**

The School Council meets once a term in the fifth week of term on a Wednesday evening.
