MOBILE PHONE AND SMART WATCH POLICY

At Winston Heights Public School, we aim to empower our students to engage and learn with confidence, courage and empathy by providing an education that inspires them to become global citizens. For the purposes of this policy, 'communication devices' refer to mobile phones and smart watches. **The school discourages students from bringing mobile phones and smart watches to school**. These communication devices can cause disruption in classrooms and the playground. They can also be used inappropriately to access social media and take photos without permission. This can cause distress and breach the privacy of others.

During the school day, parents are able to contact their children by calling the school phone number 9624 7485. If a parent feels it is necessary for their child to bring a communication device (mobile phone or smart watch) to school, then the rules for student use of mobile phones and smart watches in the school are listed below:

Devices brought to and kept at school are used entirely at their owner's risk. Winston Heights Public School cannot accept any responsibility for theft, loss or damage of these devices. Students and parents should also recognise that mobile devices are a highly prized target for theft.

Smart phone and smart watch notification alerts and location must be switched off.

☐ Phones and watches are not to be used to call home in an emergency. This is the duty of the school and the administrator/teacher in charge.

E Phones and watches are not to be used to call home in the event of a mishap at school or because belongings have been forgotten. Parents will be informed of any events that have impacted their child.

Phones and watches are not to be used in the classroom, playground or incursion/excursion for any of the following purposes; make phone calls, check text messages, access games, browse the internet, view images, use the camera or record videos.

 \square Phones and watches are not to be used to harass, bully or intimidate students or staff.

Breaches will be dealt with as per the school's Discipline Policy.

Any use of mobile phones and smart watches by a student, that is in breach of these rules, will lead to the confiscation of the device by the principal or a member of staff. In this instance, parents will be notified and confiscated devices will need to be collected from the school office by the student's parent or guardian at the end of the day.

Chaplain Chat Term 4 Week 4

Hi again! I hope you enjoyed the video about childhood anxiety that Georges River Council sponsored. It's great to see a council taking the lead on mental health. The strategies in the video and in the book (Mr Jitters) can easily be adapted for older children and grown ups. Perhaps you found it helpful for your own concerns. I had a look at the Youtube Channel of Georges River Council <u>https://www.youtube.com/channel/UCmKAGJX9y_A4a7Y7m3xHZkg</u> and discovered that the other two videos are now available, and in fact, there are many videos there about mental health. I am going to put them all up on the Google Wellbeing Classroom so you can find them whenever you want via your child's portal. For now, here are the links. A lot of what works for improving mental health involves learning how our brains and our thinking works. Finding out about these processes can give us and our kids so much more power over their troublesome thoughts and feelings (and their worry monsters too). These videos are great for helping our children to be more informed and therefore more powerful and optimistic. When your child has watched them all, get them to draw their own worry monster. Give him a name and colour him in. I guarantee he (or she) will not look nearly so frightening on your fridge as he feels in your child's head. Your child could even come up with some silly voices to mock his taunts.
