2021 School Organisation

This year, we have seen many staffing changes due to a variety of factors – staff receiving positions and promotions at other schools, staff returning from roles in other schools, family circumstances and personal reasons. Our staff (teaching, admin and support) are extremely dedicated professionals who work above and beyond to provide the best possible learning environment and education for our students. On behalf of Mrs Creagh and Mrs Angeloudis, I would like to thank our always supportive community for your understanding with the many staffing changes that have occurred throughout the year.

The layout of classes across the school for 2021 will look a little different to the current organisation, this is to allow grade and stage classes to be located within close proximity of each other. We understand that these changes may unsettle some students. Please be reassured that we will do out best to support all students over the coming weeks and when transitioning them into the new school year.

There will be a few staffing changes in 2021, with some well-known and greatly respected teachers moving to other schools and positions next year. We wish Mrs Goodall, Mrs Volpe, Mr Fitzsimmons and Miss Boyd all the best in 2021 and thank them for their passion, enthusiasm and dedication shown towards our school and students. We look forward to seeing them back at WHPS in the future.

This Term S3B built and programmed a LEGO Mindstorm robot.






In small groups students used software to program their robots and complete missions.

"High School - the next Adventure"

Chaplain Chat

Do you have a child heading off to high school in 2021? The adventure of growing up is about to get real. No doubt there are a lot of conversations in your home about this. If you would like to help your child prepare, then here are some topics that you might like to discuss with them:

- What <u>challenges</u> does your child forsee in high school? Where can they go to find the resources or get help with these challenges? What can they do in response to these challenges?
- What strategies do they use now to manage <u>stress</u>? What is the difference between good and bad stress? What have they seen others do to manage stress? They could try the "hangry" meditation. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=qJ4yZnnPj7A
- Who are their <u>support networks</u>? What does that mean? How can they help? What qualities would they look for in someone who supports them?
- What qualities or attributes do they look for in <u>friends</u>? What makes them feel comfortable with someone (e.g. someone who likes the same pet as them, etc). How would they find that out when they meet someone new?
- How can they be <u>resilient</u>? What does that mean for starting high school? https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=HU3DsJ5aNZw What would they say to a friend who isn't resilient?
- What is <u>optimism</u>? What is <u>gratitude</u>? How can these attitudes make your child stronger and more resilient? How can we develop them? Why will these traits be important in high school? Come up with some ways to make optimism and gratitude features of everyday life.
- What <u>time management</u> strategies will they need? (e.g. school diary, timetable, assignment planning, pack bags night before, colour coding, apps?) How can they start practising these now? Why might these be important?
- What are your child's <u>goals</u> for the future? What would they like to do? How would they like to think of themselves? How would they like others to think of them? Why are these goals important? How will they know they have achieved them?

How have you gone with the conversations with your near-highschooler? I hope this has helped them prepare for the new adventure they face in 2021. I hope they have helped you too. High school is an adventure for parents too, a bit like a roller coaster. I hope the ride is a great one.

Reverse Christmas Tree




As a tradition each year our school sets up a Reverse Christmas Tree in the office foyer.

The last day for presents is Monday 14th December 2020.


