Dear Parents,

What Parents Can Do to Support Their Child's Learning

It is hard to believe we are already coming to the end of Week 4. All students are settled in their classrooms and have set up their own learning goals for the first part of the term. Please ask your child about their learning goals. We want all children to be able to articulate their learning and know what they need to do to improve and to make progress. Each student has a Literacy, a Numeracy and a Personal Goal.

Please take a moment to read through the list of some things that you can do to help your child with their learning. It seems that everyone's lives get so busy. Running from after school pickup to a sport activity, then back home to get dinner ready and do homework, often see many of the happenings that used to be family bonding activities pushed aside due to lack of time. When I say family bonding activities I mean reading together, going shopping, cooking or preparing a meal, discussing what happened in the day, gardening, going on an outing in the car or on public transport. All these type of activities are learning events for your children and they really need to be part of their growing up.

- Reading with your child your child sees that you value reading too. Ask them questions and talk about the pictures.
- Let your child assist you with cooking measuring ingredients to make a cake or preparing a casserole enable a child to practise learnt skills in Maths, in an authentic environment, showing a real purpose for what they are learning in maths.
- Taking your child shopping with a shopping list provides a number of great ways for them to practise their learning. Reading the shopping list, looking for the items according to aisle numbers and categories of products, looking at the prices and working out price differences and dealing with money. All valuable experiences.
- Going on a family outing using public transport enables the family to plan a trip. Looking at timetables for buses, trains, ferries are all tasks that the children learn about in school but putting it into practice in a safe supportive environment with the family enables a child to know what they learn at school is useful for their life outside of school.

These are just a few ideas that you can do to support your child's learning. Sadly some of these activities are no longer done as a family due to busy schedules, work commitments and technology advancements. How many people do their shopping online, have takeaway for dinner and buy cakes and treats instead of making them? I totally understand that people have very busy lives but wouldn't it be nice if we all take a step back, remember what it was like when we were children and how many more things we did with the family to practise some essential skills and didn't use so much technology.

Meet the Teacher/Parent Information Chats

Thank you to the many parents who attended the Meet the Teacher sessions last week. It is extremely important to make the connections between home and school to ensure the best possible outcomes for your child's learning. By working together as a team – parents/carers, the classroom teacher and the student, the greatest conditions are established for a positive learning environment to stimulate improvement in learning, social, emotional, creative and sporting endeavours throughout the year.

If you were unable to attend the available times to meet with your child's teacher you can always call the office or request an appointment through the School App. The teacher will then contact you to make a mutually convenient time when you can meet.

Pobble

Pobble is an educational platform, designed by and for teachers to help improve children's writing ability. It can be used to provide opportunities to read other student's work to spark inspiration and includes self and peer assessment to support learning. An authentic audience provides a purpose to write and builds self-esteem. This platform provides a space for reliable teacher assessment and feedback to improve students writing ability.

The school is using Pobble this year, particularly in Years 3-6, to engage students in writing tasks and improve the quality of writing in a variety of genres.

Swimming Carnival

Well done to all our students who attended the swimming carnival last week. We were very lucky to hold the carnival, considering rain and storms were predicted. The weather was kind to us enabling a smooth swimming carnival to be completed yet again. Thank you to Mr Nicolussi and Miss Favell for your organisation. Swimming ribbons were presented today at the K-6 Assembly. All events were timed at the carnival as we could not run finals on the day. Students who have made the school team to attend the Castle Hill PSSA Zone event will be notified shortly. Qualifying times are observed for students to be able to attend the zone carnival.






