Celebrating birthdays

If you would like to send a treat in to school for your child's birthday, please ensure the treats are:

- · Commercially produced and individually sealed.
- If providing lollies or other treats, each lolly must be commercially and individually wrapped.
- · be in the original packaging.

Please be aware we have students in our school with life threatening allergies to nuts, so please do not send items containing nuts to school. We request you include a list of ingredients to accompany the food items sent into school. If your child has an allergy, you might like to send in some treats for your child to enjoy during these times. We are more than happy to keep these in the freezer at school if required. Due to health and safety regulations, candles should not be sent in.

Meet the Teacher - Parent Information Chats for Students in Year 1-6

Meet the Teacher - Parent Information Chats will be held in Week 6 (Monday 1 March to Friday 5 March) for Years 1-6. This year, there will be individual 10 minute interviews to enable parents to meet their child's teacher and share valuable information about your child. Each 'chat' will take place in your child's classroom - either before 8:30am or after 3:00pm.

Further information will be sent home detailing how to book your 10minute chat with your child's teacher via School Interviews online.

In order to meet the Department of Education Term 1 COVID-19 Guidelines we have put the following measures in place for the Meet the Teacher Chats:

- only one adult per student will be able to attend
- no students will be able to attend the 10 minute meeting
- meetings will be held in your child's classroom
- parents are asked to wait outside the classroom and to maintain a minimum of 1.5 metres from other adults on school grounds
- hand sanitiser and Service NSW QR Check-in code will be available at the entrance to each classroom
- parents will need to leave the school grounds as soon as their meeting has finished
- meetings are scheduled over five days to minimise the number of visitors on site
- a COVID-Safe Plan has been created to manage and minimise risks as per DoE requirements

Meet the Teacher - Parent Information Chats for Students in Kindergarten

Our Meet the Teacher information session for our Kindergarten parents will be held on Wednesday 3 March 6pm to 7pm. During the presentation held in your child's Kindergarten class, the teacher will outline important information about our Kindergarten programs and school life at Winston Heights PS.

In order to meet the Department of Education Term 1 COVID-19 Guidelines we have put the following measures in place for the kindergarten Meet the Teacher information session:

- only one adult per student will be able to attend
- no students will be able to attend the information session
- information sessions will be held in your child's kindergarten classroom
- parents are asked to wait outside the classroom and to maintain a minimum of 1.5 metres from other adults on school grounds
- hand sanitiser and Service NSW QR Check-in code will be available at the entrance to each classroom
- parents will need to leave the school grounds as soon as their meeting has finished
- a COVID-Safe Plan has been created to manage and minimise risks as per DoE requirements

Dogs Not Permitted on School Grounds

We understand that pets are often a much-loved part of your family and walking your dog to and from school is a healthy experience for you all. I have noticed that, on occasion, some people have brought their dogs onto school grounds while waiting to pick up their child/ren.

I remind all visitors to our school, that dogs are not allowed on school grounds except where the principal has given permission. With the exception of working dogs, all dogs must be kept on a leash if permitted to be on school grounds.

Keeping Everyone Safe - Pedestrian Safety

You and your child should always use a pedestrian crossing if there is one available. It is the safest point at which to cross a road.

We have observed some unsafe practices around the pedestrian crossings on Langdon Road and Buckleys Road recently. We have noted the following:

- cars parking on the pedestrian crossing to let students out of the car;
- parents with their children running out onto the pedestrian crossing without looking left and right for cars

Thankfully, no-one was hurt when we saw the above incidents happen. However, I would like to take this opportunity to remind all parents and students about safe road and pedestrian behaviour around pedestrian crossings. Children's crossings

Children's crossings are usually part-time crossings that operate before and after school hours. They can also operate at other times when children use the crossing for excursions or during break times. When the

red 'Children Crossing' flags are displayed, you must stop at the white line if pedestrians are waiting to cross. Drivers must remain stopped until the crossing is clear of pedestrians.



Pedestrian crossings (zebra crossings)

Talk with your child about waiting until all vehicles have stopped before starting to cross. Some drivers may not stop for pedestrians. If you are driving, you must slow down and stop when a pedestrian steps onto a marked crossing. You must give way to any pedestrian on the crossing. Crossings with poor visibility have zigzag white lines painted on the road to warn drivers.

If there is school crossing supervisor, hold hands with your child and wait together on the footpath, at least one step back from the edge of the road, until the supervisor indicates that it is safe to enter the crossing.

If you are driving, you must stop until the crossing supervisor's hand-held sign is no longer displayed, or until the supervisor indicates that you may proceed through the crossing.

Cash or late orders cannot be accepted. Thanks to Amber Edmonds for coordinating Book Club for 2021.


Library Monitors




