

Chaplain Chat Week 10

Hi and welcome again to Chaplain Chat. We are still working through our anxiety program but today I want to show you another resource that is available to help your child (and yourself) with issues that may be coming up for them at home or at school.



Google Wellbeing Classroom:

All children at Winston Heights have access to the Google Wellbeing classroom. I am always working on this resource to make it better and better, adding ideas and making it more user friendly. Resources are organised into topics and then labelled with the particular stage that it's most appropriate for. There is also a resources for parents topic and mental health resources for adults. The Wellbeing classroom focuses particularly on anxiety, mindfulness, resilience, grief and social skills and there is much overlap in the way these topics impact each other. If you have any questions about this resource, please phone or email me via the school. If your child is not already a member, they can follow the instructions below. Parents can't join themselves, but they can use their child's portal to access the resources.

How to Join: Your child can join by simply:

- logging into their student portal,
- clicking gsuite,
- click google classroom
- and clicking the the + symbol at the top left.
- Add this code: m5bxex in the box marked class code, and you are ready to start.
- Then use the "Classwork" tab above the banner (see the picture above) to find the different topics down the left side. Within the topic, each heading tells what the activity is about, and has a guide for what age group is most suitable for that activity.

If you come across any links that don't work, or instructions that are not well explained, please let me know and I will fix it asap. More resources are added often and your child is alerted by email when that happens.

I hope this is helpful and also fun. Wishing you a great holiday.


Children are also offered the opportunity to enjoy a popper and popcorn for their recess which can be pre-ordered by you via the **flexischools** app.



Canteen Term 3 Roster is open and ready for volunteers to take a look at and sign up. Included in the newsletter is all the information you need to know about being a volunteer in the Canteen, how to start and what jobs are completed in each shift.

If you would like to give a shift a go please follow the process below and make a comment that it is your first time volunteering.


We use SignUp.com to organise our upcoming SignUps.

Here's how it works in 3 easy steps:

- 1) Click this link to see our SignUp on SignUp.com: https://signup.com/go/tCAMCUJ
- 2) Review the options listed and choose the spot(s) you like.
- 3) Sign up! It's Easy you will NOT need to register an account or keep a password on SignUp.com.

Note: SignUp.com does not share your email address with anyone. If you prefer not to use your email address, please email canteen@winstonheightspandc.com and you can be signed you up manually.

New Volunteer Information

Firstly, thank you for volunteering your time to help in the Canteen!

Before you start.

The school requires you to have a current Working With Children Check (WWCC). This can be obtained from Services NSW.

You will also need to complete a one-time only 100-point ID check to sign in at the school office. Once you have these, you're able to volunteer and help with many activities at the school. If you have any questions about this, please contact the school office.

Types of canteen shifts.

Over-the-counter sales (OTC). These currently run on Tuesdays and Fridays, from 1.00pm-2.00pm. You will be the only volunteer on duty, but Year 6 students are rostered on to help.

AM shift (9.00am-11.30am). These currently are on Mondays, Wednesdays and Thursdays. You will generally be the only volunteer on duty. The focus of this shift is to tally all the recess and lunch orders; complete recess orders; start food preparation for lunch orders; and serve at the counter at recess.

PM shift (11.00am-2.00pm). These currently are on Mondays, Wednesdays and Thursdays. You will be one of two volunteers on duty. The focus of this shift is to complete food preparation for lunch orders including making sandwiches and burgers; pack all the lunch baskets with food and drinks; serve at the counter at lunch; and count the daily cash takings.

All day shift (9.00am-2.00pm). This combines both the AM and PM shifts.

Training.

You won't be left alone on your first day. An experienced volunteer will work with you for the first 2-3 shifts, or until you are comfortable to do the shift by yourself (for OTC and AM shifts). You'll always be alongside another volunteer on the PM shift.

On the Day.

An overview of a typical day in the Canteen is detailed on the sign "WHPS Canteen Timetable", which is printed out and posted on the fridge in the Canteen. There are also many other useful signs in the canteen to guide you.

As a "Thank you".

The Canteen Committee appreciates your time in volunteering and as a thank you, you're entitled to free food and drinks up to the value of \$4.00 for you or your children. This is only available on the day that you volunteer.


