#### **SCHOOL ORGANISATION FOR 2023**

Our school has begun the complex process of organising school and class structures for 2023.

In order to ensure that the needs of students are met, parents and carers are invited to forward information that you believe should be considered in regards to the formation of classes for next year. Requests can include information regarding medical conditions, requests to have particular children separated and/or any other aspect that you feel may have an impact on your child's learning.

Parents are asked to forward requests to the Principal, Mrs Bullock, in writing no later than **Friday 18 November** to ensure that your request can be considered when classes are formed by the teachers and executive team.

Please note that consideration for placement with specific teachers and/or students are unable to be considered due to the complexity of school organisation. Whilst we make every effort to accommodate requests, please note this is not always possible due to the complex nature of forming classes.

#### ARE YOU LEAVING WHPS AT THE END OF THE YEAR?

To assist with school planning for 2023, it is essential to know the anticipated student enrolment numbers for next year.

If your child is currently in Kindergarten to Year 5 and will be leaving our school at the end of the year, could you please inform the office as soon as possible.

#### **Compulsory School Attendance - Information for Parents**

Education for your child is important and regular attendance at school is essential for your child to achieve their educational best and increase their career and life options. NSW public schools work in partnership with parents to encourage and support regular attendance of children and young people. When your child attends school every day, learning becomes easier and your child will build and maintain friendships with other children.

#### **Application for Extended Leave - Travel**

This year, we have seen an increase in families planning and taking holidays during school term. We thank families who have notified the school in advance when their child will be absent.

When a student will be absent for 6 or more days due to travel and family holidays, parents will be asked to complete an application for *Extended Leave - Travel*. This is a NSW Department of Education process with guidelines found in the Department of Education's *School Attendance Policy* and *Student Attendance in Government Schools Procedures* (School Attendance Policy PD 2005 0259).

As Principal, I need to ensure adherence to all NSW DoE policy and guidelines.

An application for *Extended Leave - Travel* may have the following outcomes:

- **Application accepted** parents issued with a Certificate of Extended Leave Travel. The absences will be recorded as "L" Leave.
- **Application not approved** parents issued a letter declining the request. In this instance, parents are able to travel with their child as planned, however the absence will be recorded as "A" Explained Unjustified.

Unfortunately, family holidays may no longer be considered under the *Exemption from School -Procedures.* Travel outside of the school holiday period is now counted as an absence and will be recorded as "A" Explained Ujustified.

Section 14.1 of the Student Attendance in Government Schools Procedures states: "From the beginning of 2015, family holidays and travel are no longer considered under the Exemption from School - Procedures. Travel outside of vacation period is now counted as an absence for statistical purposes."

In declining leave applications for a family holiday, I am following the guidelines contained in the Student Attendance in Government Schools Procedures.

I understand parents/carers may wish to seek further information when an application for leave has been declined. As always, please feel free to contact the office to make a time to meet with me.

#### Financial assistance

More so now than ever, families may be experiencing financial hardship, which may place increasing demands on the family budget. If you are unable to pay for school activities, uniforms, or excursions because of financial difficulties, you may be eligible for assistance from the school.

We want all students to have essential uniform items and learning resources for school, and to be able to participate in school activities and excursions. No child should miss out or be excluded due to financial hardship.

Families wishing to discuss financial assistance from the school are encouraged to contact the office to organise a confidential conversation with me. This will allow the school to assess and discuss possible financial support on a case-by-case basis. Assistance may then be applied in the most helpful way, which may include delayed or split payments, borrowing of resources/materials, provision of

uniform articles, discounts, or full support for some items. All conversations will remain discreet, and confidential and will remain with the Principal and School Administration Manager (SAM).



We've almost made it halfway through Term 4. Our students are busy learning and participating in school activities and our teachers are busy writing student Semester 2 reports and preparing for our end-of-year events such as our Presentation Day assemblies. Let's hope the run down to the end of the year is all smooth sailing ...

#### Chaplain Chat

#### Boundaries in Friendships

A lot of students talk to me about friendship issues. Everyone wants to have better friendships, but they aren't always sure how to. One issue is boundaries. Setting healthy boundaries is crucial for building strong relationships and a foundation of respect for yourself and others and it's a great conversation to have with your children because the school environment often leads to children stretching their boundaries too much. Teaching kids at a young age about their own limits and the importance of respecting others, helps them to better navigate those boundaries as adults. This can be as easy as having the right language for it. The poster below offers some simple words to describe good boundaries. (I also have a blank version that you can add your own great boundary descriptions to. If you want one, just send me an email)

It might also be a good idea to enlarge the poster and print it, and put it in a place where you and your child can easily see it to help remind you of different ways to strengthen and hold their boundaries.

#### Nutrition Snippet

#### CAULIFLOWER BARLEY SALAD



2% cup pearl barley 2 cups caulifoxer florts 2 tsp olive oil 1 tsp oglic powder 1 cup mixed cherry tomatoes, halve 1 cup mixed cherry tomatoes, halve 1 cup baby spinach % cup parley, chopped % cup mint, chopped 1 lemon, juiced 1 lemon juiced

#### Method

I) Pro-heat oren to 180°C.
2) Line a baking ray with baking paper.
3) Cook barley in a large pot of balling water for 20 minutes or until tender.

5) In a large box (bace the barley caulifower, red onion, tomatoes, occumber, bash sgrinch, mint and parsiely.
6) Dirzcie with the lemon juice and erars olive oil and toss to combine.
